Up to 40 children and young people pass away year and up to 400 are treated in their own homes. Gully's aims to support them and their families in practical ways supplying things like extra bedding and equipment over and above NHS remit.

You may remember in the last newsletter we mentioned about Jamie & Marianne from 1st Hamworthy Scouts who were two of the Mayor's youth escorts this year, unfortunately we forgot to mention Louisa from 1st Lilliput who is also a Mayor's Youth Escort, so apologies to Louisa for missing her out! She's told us a bit about what they get up to below.

"If you ever get the chance to be a Mayor's Youth Escort, grab it. I've been a Youth Escort for the Mayor of Poole Cllr Peter Adams since May and have had some great times that I will never forget.

This year the Mayor chose 3 Youth Escorts; Jamie & Marianne from 1st Hamworthy Scouts and me from 1st Lilliput Sea Scouts. We attend formal events such as the Civic Parade, Remembrance Day Service and, this year being the centenary, other World War 1 commemorations held in Poole.

Our role is to be a useful extra pair of hands by helping the Civic Party, representing the youth of the town or even reading a speech at a church Service, which I did at the WW1 Church Service in August.

I've also met some interesting people; the High Sheriff of Dorset, the Police & Crime Commissioner and other Mayors from Dorset. Everyone has been really friendly and made us feel very welcome. I have also learned a great deal about our town of Poole and its history.

But I've never had to polish my shoes so much!...even though that doesn't really sound very appealing it's worth it because you are representing your scout troop and are spotted in photos, like in the Daily Echo, for example, and have to look extremely smart!

Our next event is the Christmas Lantern Parade at Poole High Street. If the opportunity ever comes your way, say yes please - I'll do it."

Setup your login now!

Compass (the new membership system for the Scout Association) is now open to all adults in Poole. To login you need to visit the scouts.org.uk website and click on members, then click compass. You will need your membership and email address that HQ have registered for you. This year's Census is now online and section leaders have been asked to upload youth data by 31st January. Compass offers many tools to leaders like welcoming adults and young people, tracking badges, keeping in contact, organising camps, managing payments and more.
